

Applying for International Undergraduate Admissions

At The University of Montana you are considered an international student if 1) you are not a U.S. Citizen or permanent resident or refugee, or 2) you are living in the U.S. under a F,B, H,J,L, OR M visa. If either of these is true, then you should complete and return this application.

International Admissions Procedures

Mail all of the following materials to The University of Montana Enrollment Services – Admissions Office.

- 1. A completed International Undergraduate Application. You may also apply for admission online by visiting <http://admissions.umt.edu>
 - Fall Semester Deadline: A completed application and all credentials must be received by July 15.
 - Spring Semester Deadline: A completed application and all credentials must be received by December 15.
- 2. A US \$30 non-refundable fee paid by international money order or check drawn on a U.S. bank. If you apply online, there is a \$36 non-refundable fee required to be paid by credit card only.
- 3. An official English language proficiency score report demonstrating one of the following:
 - 61 iBT on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or
 - 5.5 on the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) or
 - 69 on the Michigan English Language Assessment Battery (MELAB) or
 - 440 on the SAT Writing Section or
 - 18 on the ACT combined English/Writing section
- 4. Official or certified academic records and grades from all secondary and post-secondary institutions. These documents must be in the original language accompanied by an English translation (you can make the translation yourself). Photocopies or scanned copies will not be accepted.
- 5. Completed Certificate of Financial Responsibility (pg. 6 of the application). Also include a bank statement or reference letter from a bank or financial institution that verifies that funds will be available to you to cover the costs for one academic year.
- 6. Photocopy of your passport or other official identification.

Conditional Admissions Procedures

Students who do not meet the required English language proficiency for full admission but are academically qualified can apply for Conditional Admission. Students should mail all of the following materials to The University of Montana Enrollment Services – Admissions office.

- 1. A completed International Undergraduate Application. You may also apply for conditional admissions online by visiting <http://admissions.umt.edu>
- 2. A US \$30 non-refundable fee paid by international money order or check drawn on a U.S. bank. If you apply online there is a \$36 non-refundable fee required to be paid by credit card only.
- 3. Official or certified academic records and grades from all secondary and post-secondary institutions. These documents should be in the original language accompanied by an English translation (you can make the translation yourself). Photocopies or scanned copies will not be accepted.
- 4. Completed Certificate of Financial Responsibility (pg. 6 in the application). Also include a bank statement or reference letter from a bank or financial institution that verifies that funds will be available to you to cover the estimated costs for one academic year.
- 5. Photocopy of your passport or other official identification.

Scholarship Opportunities

UM Entering Student Scholarship

All incoming undergraduate international students will be considered for the UM Entering Student Scholarships. Scholarships are awarded based on the completed International Application. No additional application is required. The Scholarship Committee will evaluate each application and award students the scholarship that best matches the students' characteristics. The scholarship can be valued from \$1,000 to \$6,000 per year.

Davidson Honors College – Presidential Leadership Scholarship

The Presidential Leadership Scholarship is The University of Montana's premier academic scholarship. Each scholarship includes a full or partial tuition waiver, the value of which varies according to the amount of tuition each year. *Note: Tuition/Fees are fixed costs. Room/Board reflects the cost of living in the residence halls with a double occupancy dorm room and a Lommasson Plus meal plan. Books/supplies are estimates and vary depending on the major.

Explanation of expenses

Tuition and Fees. The tuition and fees shown on this page are for a full-time lower division undergraduate student load of 12-21 credits each semester (for two semesters). In addition to basic educational costs, tuition and fees support services such as student activities and provide access to the Curry Health Center, computer services and athletic events. An orientation fee of \$65 is assessed the first semester only. Tuition and fees are paid on a semester basis. Junior and senior level tuition is slightly higher.

Room and Board. The estimate is based on a double-occupancy room and the most popular meal plan. UM also offers suites, single-room housing options, and various meal plans, which would affect room and board costs.

Books and Supplies. Books and school supplies vary depending upon each course. Textbooks and other materials can be purchased at the University Center Bookstore or online at <http://www.montanatextbooks.com/>

Health Insurance. UM requires all students to have medical insurance for hospitalization or referral beyond UM's Curry Health Center. Students may purchase Blue Cross/Blue Shield of Montana major medical insurance at the beginning of each semester. Students who can prove that they have insurance that is equal to or better than Blue Cross/Blue Shield are eligible to waive this insurance at registration. Insurance purchased Spring Semester will continue to cover students through the summer.

Personal expenses. Personal expenses include local travel, entertainment, and other costs that vary greatly with lifestyle. For instance, parking permits cost \$185 per year for a car.

Additional Financial Information

Summer living expenses. International students may choose to remain in the U.S. during the regular three-month vacation period (mid-May through mid-August), which is not part of the regular academic year. Students who stay in the U.S. should plan to spend at least another \$1,500 for living expenses. Students who wish to enroll for summer semester courses should expect to pay tuition and fees comparable to those for the academic year. Summer expenses are not reflected in cost figures elsewhere.

Dependents. If international students are bringing dependents to the U.S., then an additional \$3,000 for their spouse and \$1,500 for each dependent will be required on the financial statement. A student must be prepared to provide proof to the consular official of sufficient funding for each accompanying dependent.

Other Financial Assistance. Other types of financial assistance are available for international students once they become a students at UM. This assistance, which is limited, may include emergency short-term loans and fee waivers. These fee waivers and emergency short-term loans are only available for international students after their first year at UM.

Campus Jobs. International students on a F-1 or J-1 visa may work on-campus up to 20 hours per week while school is in session. During the vacation periods the employment may be full-time for students who are eligible and intend to register for the next academic term.
