

# Application for Undergraduate Admission

We are glad you are considering applying for undergraduate admission to The University of Montana. We encourage you to apply early to ensure a smooth transition to the University. If you submit this application and all required documents by the following dates, you will receive priority in admission processing: Autumn semester—March 1; Spring semester—November 15. Applications received after the priority dates are considered on a space-available basis. If you have questions about admission requirements or the application process, please contact Enrollment Services – Admissions.

## Freshman Admission

If you are a first-time college student, you must meet the following admission requirements and college preparatory classes in addition to completing the freshman application procedures.

### Freshman Application Procedures

Applying for admission as a new freshman is a three-step process. You will complete the first two steps before you are admitted, the third step is completed once you graduate from high school:

1. Submit a complete admission application and submit the \$36 application fee on-line. (Or you may also submit the attached application form with a \$30 check enclosed.) If you are still in high school, you must include the Self-Report of High School Courses. If you are unsure of anything concerning your academic record, consult your guidance counselor.
2. Request that your ACT or SAT test results be sent to the Admissions Office directly from the testing company. All freshmen under 21 must take the ACT or SAT test. UM's ACT code is 2422; UM's SAT code is 4489.
3. Request a final high school transcript upon graduation. This transcript must include your date of graduation and final GPA.

## Admission Requirements

In addition to college preparatory class requirements, you must meet one criterion in each of the following three categories:

- An ACT composite score of 22; or a SAT combined score of 1540; or a 2.50 cumulative grade point average; or a class rank in the upper half of your high school graduating class.
- A score of 22 on the ACT Math section; or a score of 520 on the SAT Math section; or a score of 3 or higher on the AP Calculus AB or BC exam or completion of a Rigorous High School Core that includes four years of math with grades of C or higher. or a score of 4 on the International Baccalaureate A1 exam.
- A score of 18 on the ACT Combined English/Writing section; or a score of 7 on the ACT Writing Test Subscore; or a score of 440 on the SAT Writing Section; or a score of 7 on the SAT Essay Subscore; or a score of 3.5 on the Montana University System Writing Assessment or a score of 3 on the AP English Language or English Literature exam or a score of 50 on the CLEP Subject Exam in Composition or a score of 4 on the International Baccalaureate Language A1 Exam

## College Preparatory Program

The Montana University System requires that you complete the following college preparatory requirements:

- Four years of English.**
- Three years of math**, including Algebra I, Geometry and Algebra II. Students are encouraged to take a math class their senior year of high school.
- Three years of social studies**, including one year of global studies, one year of American history and one year of government or another third-year course (i.e., economics, psychology, sociology).
- Two years of laboratory science.** One must be earth science, biology, chemistry or physics. The second year may be one of those sciences or another approved college preparatory laboratory science.
- Two years chosen from the following:** foreign language (preferably two years), computer science, visual and performing arts, or vocational education.

## Transfer Admission

A transfer student is considered to be someone who has graduated from high school or has earned their GED and attempted 12 or more college-level credits.

**Transfer Application Procedures** Applying for admission as a transfer student is a two-step process:

1. Apply and submit payment online of \$36 (includes transmittal fee) or complete the application for admission in this packet and attach a \$30 payment. Make checks payable to The University of Montana. Application fees are not refundable.
2. Send a current official transcript from each college you've attended so that we may process your admission without delays. Then, send a complete, official transcript as soon as you complete your final term.

## Home School Student Admission Requirements

- In addition to a completed application, please submit a written statement of curriculum including all courses that you have completed at the high school level. If you have completed a pre-packaged program and receive transcripts, then the transcripts are required.
- Submit a letter of verification from the instructor(s). This can be a parent or an outside teacher that states they did instruct you.
- If you are unable to produce a four year curriculum and/or the official verification letter from the instructor, then you will be required to take the General Education Development Test (GED)
- You must take the ACT or SAT exam. Official scores of at least 22 on the ACT composite or a combined score of 1540 on the SAT is required.
- Math and Writing Proficiency requirements must be met to be admitted to The University of Montana. This is determined by the student's standardized test scores of the ACT or SAT. Please review page 2 for required scores.
- The Montana University System requires that you complete the College Preparatory Program listed on page 2.
- If you are applying under the age of seventeen, your file will automatically be selected to go to a review committee. This committee evaluates if a students is academically and emotionally prepared for college.

## Traditional-age Freshmen with GED Admission Requirements

First-time college students who are not yet 21 and have earned a GED must submit an application and the fee (preferably on-line), and have transcripts and GED scores sent to the Admissions Office. Traditional aged students must take the ACT or SAT test.

## Non-traditional Student Admission Requirements

Non-traditional age applicants (over 21 years old or out of high school more than three years) submit a complete application with payment (preferably on-line) and request high school or college transcripts or GED scores be sent to Enrollment Services – Admissions. Non-traditional students will be admitted conditionally if test scores are not posted on the high school transcript or if a student has never taken the ACT or SAT or if the high school Grade Point Average is less than 2.5.

## International Student Admission

At The University of Montana, you are considered an international student if:

1. You are not a U.S. Citizen or permanent resident or refugee; or
2. You are living in the U.S under an F,B,H,J,L. or M visa

**If either of the above is true, then you should fill out and return the International Student Admission application.**

## Conditional Admission Process

Students who fail to meet the admissions standards or those who meet the standards but have low test scores or a low grade point average will be referred to the Admissions Committee to determine if they may be admitted on a "Conditional Status". Students accepted conditionally must complete 24 credits and earn a cumulative Grade Point Average of 2.0 within three semesters in order to continue studies on the main UM campus. If you are not accepted to UM-Missoula, you may be offered full admission to the UM College of Technology.

## Returning University of Montana Students-Readmission

Students who have previously enrolled at The University of Montana-Missoula and interrupted their enrollment for 24 months or more must submit an application for readmission. Applications for readmission may be obtained from the Registrar's Office or online at <http://www.umt.edu/registrar/alumniparents/readmission.aspx>

## Scholarships

**Montana Residents Scholarships:** UM Scholarships are awarded based on merit. Montana Residents are eligible for the Presidential Leadership Scholarship and Montana Resident Entering Student Scholarship. The deadline for the Presidential Leadership Scholarship is December 31. To be eligible for the Montana Resident Entering Student Scholarship, students must apply and be accepted to The University of Montana. Completed applications for admissions must be submitted by December 31. Students will be notified early March.

**Non-Resident Scholarships:** UM Scholarships are awarded based on merit. Non-Residents are eligible for the Presidential Leadership Scholarship and Non-Resident Entering Student Scholarships, including the Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE). The deadline for the Presidential Leadership Scholarship is December 31. To be eligible for Non-Resident scholarships and awards, students must apply and be accepted to The University of Montana. The priority scholarship deadline is December 31. Awarding will begin mid-November.
